









## Stonemasonry in Context The ARTIFEX Workshop

14-28 of June 2009

The intersection between the natural and the creative is subject of profound debate. This places production at the crossroads of a pending reconfiguration that will invariably transform the way we formulate reproducible ideas, if giving consideration to material, cultural and environmental economies is that which can no longer be ignored. Specific, collaborative revisions of existing productive practices may lead to visual and mechanical innovations that may foster these reconfigurations along.

This workshop will convene a transversal selection of experts from various fields and institutions including Cambridge University, ETSAM and MIT who will provide its participants an experimental, multidisciplinary platform of lectures and exercises combining stonemasonry, mediterranean building techniques, and bioclimatic construction filtered through the lens of contemporary design. Artifexbalear, a promising stonemasonry and bioclimatic design school of Inca, Mallorca, founded and directed by Miguel Ramis, master stonemason, researcher and sculptor will serve as site for this two-week event. To survey stonemasonry and brickvaulting as re-emerging alternatives for innovative, cost-effective, ecological design;

To review a range of stonemasonry building solutions, that, through discussions and collaborative research, will lead to the design and construction of a full-scale prototype;

To introduce the **Artifex Workshop** as an annual summer initiative directed and coordinated by Luis Berríos-Negrón, Michael Ramage and Miguel Ramis to spur continued contemporary dialogues between architecture, construction and the creative practices.
